## Preparations Begin for 2004 City Officers Election

The 2004 City Officers election will be held on Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup> according to City Secretary Jeanne Fralicks.



At the present time, the scope of the election includes the office of Mayor as well as Councilmembers to represent Districts 2 and 4. Glenn Repp is currently serving his third term as Mayor, while District 2 is represented by Scott Cannon and District 4 is represented by Grady Smithey.

Applications for a place on the ballot are available at City Hall in the office of the City Secretary. City qualifications for candidacy include: qualified voter; resident of the State of Texas for one year; resident of the City and district for six months; and hold no other public office. The first day to file an application for a place on the ballot is Monday, February 16. The application deadline is 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 15.

Only residents of Districts 2 and 4 may vote for their respective candidates. The Mayor, however, is elected at large with all residents of the City casting ballots.

# Fire Extinguishers

## National Fire Prevention Association Fact Sheet

A portable fire extinguisher can save lives and property by putting out a small fire or containing it until the fire department arrives; but portable extinguishers have limitations. Because fire grows and spreads so rapidly, the number one priority for residents is to get out safely.

### Safety Tips:

- Use a portable fire extinguisher when the fire is confined to a small area, such as a wastebasket, and is not growing; everyone has exited the building; the fire department has been called or is being called; and the room is not filled with smoke.
- To operate a fire extinguisher, remember the word PASS:
  - Pull the pin. Hold the extinguisher with the nozzle pointing away from you, and release the locking mechanism.
  - Aim low. Point the extinguisher at the base of the fire.
  - Squeeze the lever slowly and evenly.
  - Sweep the nozzle from side-to-side.
- For the home, select a multi-purpose extinguisher (can be used on all types of home fires) that is large enough to put out a small fire, but not so heavy as to be difficult to handle.
- Choose a fire extinguisher that carries the label of an independent testing laboratory.
- Read the instructions that come with the fire extinguisher and become familiar with its parts and operation before a fire breaks out. Local fire departments or fire equipment distributors often offer hands-on fire extinguisher trainings.
- Install fire extinguishers close to an exit and keep your back to a clear exit when you use the device so you can make an easy escape if the fire cannot be controlled. If the room fills with smoke, leave immediately.
- Know when to go. Fire extinguishers are one element of a fire response plan, but the primary element is safe escape. Every household should have a home fire escape plan and working smoke alarms.

# Identity Theft - It can happen to you!

Identity theft- Those of you who have been victims already know the damage it can cause. Don't think for a moment that it can't happen to you, a friend, or a loved one. Everything you do leaves a trail of information for other to see or obtain, if not careful it could be obtained and used for someone else's gain.

Sometimes an ID thief can strike even when you've been very careful. One of the best ways to catch identity theft is to regularly check your credit record. Order your credit report from each of the three major credit bureaus (listed below) each year, and make sure all the information is correct. A missing credit card bill could mean an identity thief has taken over your credit card account and changed your billing address to cover his tracks. Follow up with creditors if your bills do not arrive on time.

Identity thieves can use information found in your wallet or purse-from credit cards, checks, your Social Security card, even health insurance cards-to establish new accounts in your name. That could create an identity crisis that can take months to detect, and even longer to clear up.

If your wallet or purse is lost or stolen, the Federal Trade Commission suggests that you:

- File a report with the police immediately. Get a copy in case your bank, credit card company or insurance company needs proof of the crime.
- Cancel each credit and charge card. Get new cards with new account numbers. Call the fraud departments of the major credit reporting agencies: Equifax (800) 525-6285; Experian (888) 397-3742; TransUnion (800) 680-7289; Ask them to put a "fraud alert" on your account and add a "victim's statement" to your file requesting that creditors contact you before opening new accounts in your name.
- Ask the credit bureaus for copies of your credit reports. Review your reports carefully to make sure no additional fraudulent accounts have been opened in your name or unauthorized changes made to your existing accounts. In a few months, order new copies of your reports to verify your corrections and changes, and to make sure no new fraudulent activity has occurred.



- Report the loss to your bank if your wallet or purse contained bank account information, including account numbers, ATM cards or checks. Cancel checking and savings accounts and open new ones. Stop payments on outstanding checks.
- Get a new ATM card, account number and Personal Identification Number (PIN) or password.
- Report your missing driver's license to the department of motor vehicles. If your state uses your Social Security number as your driver's license number, ask to substitute another number.
- Change the locks on your home and car if your keys were taken. Don't give an identity thief access to even more personal property and information.

It is a misdemeanor to park a vehicle on your front or side yard. Vehicles should be parked on improved surfaces like a driveway or parked parallel on City right-of-way in "non curb-and-gutter" areas.
