City Election Set for May 7th

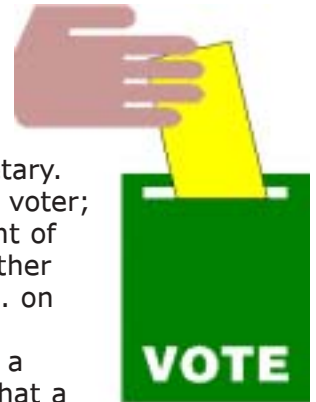
Preparations continue for the city election to be held Saturday, May 7th according to City Secretary Jeanne Fralicks.

This year's slate of offices includes the Councilmember at large position and Councilmembers to represent Districts 1, 3 and 5.

Applications for a place on the ballot are available at City Hall in the office of the City Secretary. City qualifications for candidacy include: qualified voter; resident of the State of Texas for one year; resident of the City and district for six months; and hold no other public office. The application deadline is 5:00 p.m. on Monday, March 7th.

On February 15th, the City Council also ordered a charter amendment election. State law provides that a

Severe Weather Awareness Week in Texas

A proclamation designating March 6 - 12, 2005 Severe Weather Awareness Week

in Texas has been issued by Gov. Rick Perry's office. Gov. Perry joined with the National Weather Service, the Governor's Division of Emergency Management and the American Red Cross to urge all Texans to be prepared for severe storms.



Severe Weather Awareness Week is an annual event that helps build public awareness about being prepared for emergencies.

Texans are advised to put together a "readiness kit" of important supplies, to keep a battery-operated radio or television set to receive important information during storms, to designate a place to go in case of evacuation and to develop an emergency plan for communicating with relatives and friends in other areas.

home rule city may conduct a charter amendment election no more frequently than every two years. The last charter amendment election was held in May 2002. "Due to several legislative changes, some provisions require amendment to be consistent with State law," Ms. Fralicks stated.

All registered voters in the City of Duncanville will have the opportunity to vote on the Councilmember at large position as well as the charter

amendments. Registered voters residing in Districts 1, 3 and 5 will also have an opportunity to vote for their respective candidates.

Anyone not currently registered to vote has until April 7th to register in order to cast a ballot in the May election. Voter registration cards may be obtained at City Hall or the Duncanville Public Library. For more information regarding voter registration, residents may contact the Dallas County Elections Department at (214) 637-7937.

Early voting will be conducted Wednesday, April 20, 2005 through Tuesday, May, 3, 2005.

Garage Burglary - A Crime of Opportunity

Springtime is fast approaching and with that comes the sprouting of all those lovely weeds separated by the few scattered patches of grass. Thus emerges the "Yard Warrior", a man or woman who has dedicated much of their time making their lawn the epitome of all lawns. The type of lawn that the angels sing on high, and that special light shines down from the heavens on your lawn.

Well, being that warrior comes at a risk. That risk is possibly having your lawn equipment or other items stolen from your garage. These people that target open garages lurk up and down streets and alleyways looking for the dedicated "Yard Warrior". They take advantage of this time to steal from you. While you are mowing the front yard, they are in the back of your home loading up their vehicle with your belongings. Some of these might be the tools that you need to have that heavenly lawn.

Remember this, if you don't remember anything else! "Criminals are creatures of opportunity! If you give them a chance they'll take the opportunity. Don't give these criminals a chance. Here are a few things to do to reduce these opportunities.

1. Keep garage doors shut when you are not around- even if you go in the house for a few minutes.
2. Keep lawn equipment out of sight when you are not around- even if you go in the house for a few minutes.
3. Keep an inventory of household and garage items with Make, Model, and Serial Numbers to provide the police and insurance companies in the event of a burglary or theft.
4. Start a Neighborhood Crime Watch Program.

REMINDER: Speaking of Burglaries! Please remember to renew your burglar alarm permits. Alarms must be registered in the City of Duncanville.

Backgrounder: Thunderstorms and Lightning

from the Federal Emergency Management Agency

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Thunderstorms can bring heavy rains (which can cause flash flooding), strong winds, hail, lightning and tornadoes. In a severe thunderstorm get inside a sturdy building and stay tuned to a battery-operated radio for weather information.

Lightning is a major threat during a thunderstorm. In the United States, between 75 to 100 Americans are hit and killed each year by lightning. If you are caught outdoors, avoid natural lightning rods such as tall, isolated trees in an open area or the top of a hill and metal objects such as wire fences, golf clubs and metal tools.

It is a myth that lightning never strikes twice in the same place. In fact, lightning will strike several times in the same place in the course of one discharge.

SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCHES AND WARNINGS

A severe thunderstorm watch is issued by the National Weather Service when the weather conditions are such that a severe thunderstorm (damaging winds 58 miles per hour or more, or hail three-fourths of an inch in diameter or greater) is likely to develop. This is the time to locate a safe place in the home and tell family members to watch the sky and listen to the radio or television for more information.

A severe thunderstorm warning is issued when a severe thunderstorm has been sighted or indicated by weather radar. At this point, the danger is very serious and everyone should go to a safe place, turn on a battery-operated radio or television, and wait for the "all clear" by the authorities.

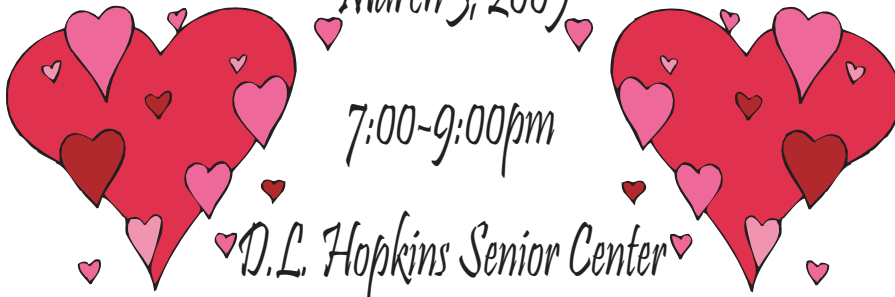

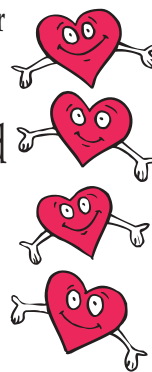
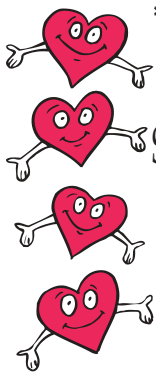

Food, paper cup or can drinks are not allowed in the Community Center or in the Library Lobby.
