

**DUNCANVILLE VIRTUAL REALITY COMMISSION

A regular meeting of the Duncanville Virtual Reality Commission was held on Tuesday, June 09, 2015, at 7:00 p.m. with a quorum present to wit:

The meeting convened in Conference Room B (near Public Works) in City Hall and was called to order at 7:05 P.M., passing. (3 for – 0 against)

The Minutes from the May 12th meeting were reviewed and approved at 7:06 P.M. (3 for – 0 against)

A copy was presented and discussions held regarding the Master Agreement between the City of Duncanville and EON Reality. The commission requested the following be asked by the secretary of Haskell Gray:

1. Do the students sign some sort of non-compete agreement with EON?
2. What is expected of the students who are also employees of Mountain View College?

Secretary Charles Smith reported the response from EON Reality that they are not currently capable of supporting tours for school-aged children, but should be once they take on additional full-time staff.

Secretary Charles Smith reported on the IDOME dimensions and costs as reported by EON Reality, ranging from \$750,000 to \$1 Million depending on size and features. The commission requested the following be researched by the secretary:

1. Is the iDome product at Six Flags similar to what is produced by EON?

The commission discussed ideas of developments to the Fieldhouse property. The commission requested the following be researched by the secretary:

1. What pedestrian access is planned between the Fieldhouse and the shopping directly to the south, on the other side of HW67?
2. What is the product output of the grill at the Fieldhouse? What is its capacity?

The commission discussed the "interactive table" product from EON for the Museum of Cultures. Haskell Gray was not fully versed, at that time, as to what interactive, holographic products were available. This issue will be re-addressed at the July 14th meeting. The commission requested the following be researched by the secretary:

1. Interactive holographic table
2. Math/Science products for children

1. Can the new Economic Development Director, Jessica James, attend our next meeting to entertain discussions with the Commission?
