

CITY COUNCIL QUARTERLY UPDATE

I. Promotions:

Accomplishments:

I. CPR Saves for Q1:

- 16 total CPR resuscitation attempts
- Of the 16 resuscitation attempts, 6 patients were resuscitated
 - 2 patients resuscitated were in a PEA rhythm
 - 4 patients resuscitated were in a shockable rhythm
(Note: American Heart Association defines a CPR Save as the resuscitation of a patient in a shockable rhythm)
 - The remaining 10 patients were in PEA or asystole rhythms

II. EMS Surveys

- Surveys are sent out weekly to patients receiving EMS services within Duncanville
- We continue to receive outstanding feedback from our citizens

Accomplishments:

I. Fire Prevention Calendar Contest:

- During Fire Prevention Week, our Fire Prevention Office holds an annual Fire Safety Calendar Contest for all 3rd and 4th grade students attending Duncanville I.S.D. schools located in the City of Duncanville
- Students are presented with 13 different Fire Safety related topics to create their drawings. Schools submit their students drawings to the Fire Prevention Office where 13 winning drawings are selected and are used to create the Fire Safety Calendar
- The recent success of the calendar contest has resulted in the participating schools, and the Fire Prevention Office, receiving an overwhelming request for Fire Safety Calendars. Because of the large number of request received, our Fire Prevention Office will partner with Duncanville I.S.D. and Duncanville Firefighters Association who will sell the Fire Safety Calendars. All proceeds from the calendar sales will be donated to Parkland Burn Camp

I. Purchase PPE Dryer Cabinets


- PPE Dryer Cabinets have been ordered. We are currently awaiting the delivery and installation of the PPE Dryer Cabinets at both stations.
