Your Public Works Department has been busy with infrastructure improvements throughout the city.

Many of these projects are currently under construction or have recently been completed such the erosion control improvement project at Lions Park. The existing retaining walls along Horne Branch were lengthened approximately 200 feet to prevent further erosion along the south bank at a cost of approximately \$119,528.00.

## Infrastructure Improvements (Continues from front page):




Lane and West Ridge Drive is almost complete. This project includes the construction of approximately 2,100 linear feet of 8 inch water line and 2,100 linear feet of 10 inch and 8 inch wastewater line, the placement of 730 tons of asphalt pavement, and 1,500 square yards of reinforced concrete pavement. This project is budgeted at \$956,848.00 but is anticipated to be completed at a significantly reduced cost. Approximately 50% complete are the FY2016 Wastewater Improvements and Sidewalk Improvements Projects. The wastewater improvements project will

install 8,100 linear feet of sanitary sewer by pipe bursting at a cost of approximately \$1,229,738.00. The sidewalk improvements project will provide new sidewalks, ADA compliant ramps, and a new hike and bike trail through Lakeside Park from Mizell to Center Streets at a cost of \$356,215.00.

## City Welcomes New Assistant Director of Public Works

Jackie is a licensed Professional Engineer with the Texas State Board of Professional Engineers and will be initially responsible for the management of engineering services as well as Service Center operations, including the Water/Wastewater, Streets, Traffic Operations, and Equipment Services divisions.



## Winter Weather Sanding Operations



During the winter months when ice or snow is anticipated, the Duncanville Street Department monitors predicted weather conditions. At least one week in advance of predicted winter weather, employees will check all equipment required during icing conditions to ensure it is working properly. Two days prior to anticipated icing conditions, one dump truck will be loaded with a sander and a de-icing aggregate called “ice chat.” At the time of the event, a duty crew will be on standby.

Sanding operations will be conducted on a pre-planned, systematic basis, organized into route sanding teams. Sanding units’ priorities include bridges, major thoroughfare intersections, and streets around all schools. Sanding units will respond to problems that have developed at locations that are not designated sanding routes but are critical to health and public safety. Sand will not normally be provided for private individuals, businesses, or residential streets unless requested by the Police or Fire Departments in the event that a true emergency situation exists.

The Traffic Operations Department will change signal lights in intersections to four- way flash if an intersection becomes hazardous. In the event that the Texas Department of Transportation closes U.S. Highway 67 and/or I.H. 20, traffic will be detoured onto local streets with signs, arrow boards and message boards until the freeway(s) re-open.

### Resource: Flood Facts

#### Questions About Flood Insurance?

What is a Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM)?

A FIRM is a flood map created by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) used by the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) for floodplain management, mitigation, and insurance purposes. A FIRM will generally show:

- Roads and map land marks
- Community's base flood elevations
- Flood zones
- Floodplain boundaries

#### How Do I Use a Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM)?

As a property owner, you can use a FIRM to get a reliable indication of what flood zone you're in. Contact your insurance agent, insurer, or the City for help with questions about whether your property is inside a flood zone. ## Take Care of Duncanville by Managing Your Leaves this Fall

As autumn brings the start of the school year, football games, and cooler temperatures, it also signals the arrival falling leaves.



While Texans are encouraged to plant shade trees to help lower their utility bills in the summer, these deciduous trees lose their leaves in the fall, in abundance. Instead of raking and bagging them, where they'll head to a landfill, put them back into your lawns and gardens, as a valuable source of mulch and fertilizer, and an addition to your compost. *Read more about managing your leaves.*



## Keep Drains Clear this Holiday Season

Remember to collect the grease and oils in a sealable container after cooking this holiday season. Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) come from meats, butters and margarine, lard, food scrapes, sauces, salad dressings, dairy products, and cooking oil. When FOG goes down the drain, it hardens and causes sewer pipes to clog. This can lead to a Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO) where raw sewage actually backs up into your home, lawn, neighborhood and streets. Not only does this nasty mess cause health issues, it also can run into nearby streams or rivers adversely affecting our drinking water. If your pipes become clogged from putting FOG down the drain, it can be a very expensive problem to fix. To avoid household and environmental damage, as well as costly bills, NEVER put FOGs down the drain!

Protect your home, city, and environment by recycling it at the Duncanville Service Center, located at 330 Shady Trail. Cooking Oil and grease will be accepted November 28-January 9th, Monday-Friday, from 7 a.m.-4 p.m. This Holiday Grease Roundup collection will be donated to the Dallas County Schools Alternative Fuels Program to be processed into biodiesel for school buses. *Click here* for more info.

The City of Duncanville provides reusable fat trapper bags and reusable can lids at the Public Works counter at City Hall or at our Service Center located at 330 Shady Trail. Wipe pans clean with a paper towel and place the paper towel in the trash. Scrape off excess food from pots, pans, and plates into the trash before rinsing them in the sink with cold water. Dispose of large quantities of cooking oil by contacting Jessica Smith, Solid Waste Coordinator, at 972-780-4946 to find the nearest household hazardous waste collection station.

The Duncanville Fire Department wants the citizens to enjoy a safe and peaceful holiday season by following these holiday season safety tips.

### Holiday Decorations:

- Outdoor lights must be made for outdoor use as they are especially made to tolerate wintery weather conditions
- Do not exceed the recommended number of strands in one circuit
- Check each strand of lights for cracked wire insulation
- Turn off indoor and outdoor lights before going to bed for the night
- Never leave lit candles unattended and always keep flammable objects away
- Keep real Christmas trees well watered and always “feel” it to see if it is getting dry. If the needles fall off easily, it has become too dry and can be a fire hazard



### Heater Fire Safety:

Now is the time to have your heaters checked. There are so many different types available that it pays to have a licensed technician service your unit every year. Here are some things you should have checked during your service:

- Gas units should always have the burners checked as well as vent stacks to prevent carbon monoxide from entering the house
- Fan motors and wiring
- Clear space around units, generally 18 inches is a minimum, 2 or 3 feet is even better
- Filters should be changed
- Thermostats should work correctly
- A more involved inspection might include the duct work, gas pressure, cutoff switches

### Chimney Fire Safety:

Wood burning fireplaces leave residue behind and over time will build up inside the chimney. This material called creosote can be highly combustible and several chimney fires happen every year because it was not removed regularly. If you use your fireplace heavily or have not had the chimney cleaned in several years you may be setting yourself up for a chimney fire.

#### *Reduce the risk of a chimney fire:*

- Limit the use of “starter” logs or manufactured logs since these tend to produce higher heat and can ignite creosote
- Allow your fireplace to cool down after several hours of use
- Make sure you have a chimney cap to prevent animals or birds from building nests. This also prevents embers from landing on your roof
- Do not use the fireplace to burn wrapping paper or other trash, these items can easily travel up the chimney and lodge in unseen areas
- After use the ashes should be removed when they have cooled significantly. The ashes should be placed in water and soaked 24 hours before discarding.



## Filming Police/Citizen Interactions Special Article by Sergeant A. Tijerina

# POLICE BEATS



With the technology of today, a majority of people have a mobile recording studio in their pocket. This, with the current social environment regarding concerns of police misconduct and excessive force, it has become common to see multiple civilians recording police interactions with the public.

Citizens have asked the question about the legality and constitutionality of this practice. This issue has also been litigated in court. In the Fifth Federal Circuit Court (which serves Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas) the court concluded in *Buehler v. City of Austin* the following: "An obvious tension exists between a police officer and an individual observing and recording that police officer. An individual has a constitutional right to assemble in a public place so as to observe and acquire information related to the police as they perform their official duties. At the same time, a police officer must be free to perform his official duties without undue interference so as to protect the officer and everyone in the vicinity. As this tension plays out, the officer on the scene of an arrest or investigation will be the arbiter of what constitutes a reasonable time, place, and manner for the exercise of the individual's First Amendment right to record."

The decision comes from a lawsuit filed by Antonio Buehler who was arrested three times by the Austin Police Department for Interference with Public Duties (Texas Penal Code 38.15). Antonio Buehler launched a group called the Peaceful Streets Project, a grassroots initiative to be more engaged in holding police accountable.

Interference with Public Duties has to do with a person interrupting, disrupting, impeding, or otherwise interfering with a peace officer while he/

she is performing a duty or exercising authority imposed or granted by law. Taking traffic stops for example, it was decided by The United States Supreme Court in *Maryland v. Wilson* in 1997 that police officers can "control" the scene of their stops. This includes such things as ordering occupants out of the stopped vehicle as well as keeping others away from the scene. The summary in this case, written by Chief Justice Rehnquist, cites mainly officer and public safety concerns.

If you decide to exercise your constitutional rights and record police interactions from a public place know the law and take into account the safety of the officer, the public, and yourself. Remember that the officer may possess unique information that you do not have at the time you approach the scene. They may be asking you to step back for your own safety. For everyone's safety, please follow all lawful orders given to you by an officer, and be cognizant of interfering with public duties.



- Shop before dark, when possible
- Coordinate shopping trips with a friend
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash
- Carry purses closed and snugly against your body
- Do not overload yourself with packages, keep hands free
- Teach your children to go to a store clerk or security guard to ask for help
- Never park in an unlit parking lot
- Have keys in hand before returning to your vehicle
- Lock packages in your vehicle trunk
