


Accomplishments

Department Activity

- Number of Use of Force Incidents: 1 – Occurred in a restaurant parking lot. Suspect attempted to strike officer. Administrative review determined force used was lawful and within policy.
- Vehicle Pursuits: 1 – Driver had a signed warrant for Aggravated Robbery. Pursuit was disregarded after 2 minutes and approximately 1 mile traveled due to weather and road conditions.
- Number of Citizen Complaints: 1 – Internally generated for failure to report to duty. Complaint was unfounded.
- Community Meeting and Partnerships: 14 meetings with over 1900 partnerships.

On May 6, 2016, the Duncanville Police Department recognized the men and women that volunteer and patrol as Citizens on Patrol for the City of Duncanville. Here are a few of their accomplishments:

- 60 Active Volunteers
- Recorded more than 1670 Vacation Checks
- Volunteer Hours – 3,143
- Citizens on Patrol Hours – 8,244
- Citizens on Patrol traveled more than 20,000 miles patrolling the streets of Duncanville.
- The Corporation for National & Community Service estimates the value of the volunteer hours for Texas at \$24.66 per hour. Based on this value, the Duncanville Police Department's Volunteers and COPs donated **\$280,803.42** to the City.
