The meeting convened in the EON Reality Conference Room and called to order at 7:07 PM

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made by Patricia Ebert; seconded by Karen Hall to approve the minutes from the January 11th Regular Meeting, passing 3-0 in favor.

Discuss creation of the Virtual Scavenger Hunt:

Ideas on the Scavenger Hunt were discussed, stating a timeline to have up and running by Spring Break. Each member submitted a list of questions on the various EON app destinations. Commissioner Dr. Judy Vergara who was not present has these questions. Haskell Grey suggested EON students could take pictures of various places around Duncanville to implement into Augmented Reality. EON Reality can develop an Augmented Reality experience in a couple of weeks; this would probably cost a few hundred dollars depending on whether it is Augmented Reality or Virtual Reality.

The Commissioners would like to know if we could test the Virtual Reality Scavenger Hunt during Spring Break and also perhaps incorporate into one of the existing programs during this time. One of Commissioner Karen Hall's goals is to immerse kids in the culture and history of Duncanville. Haskell Grey suggested using Duncanville's basketball history; stating the more intriguing it is the better experience the kids will have in remembering. Commissioner Hall would like the kids to also see the potential in turning virtual reality into a career.

Commissioner Evelana Garrett Brown said we could advertise on the LED sign to get interest and also highlight the Virtual Reality Commission as part of another program. EON has four tablets they are willing to loan out and Haskell said he will also get more of the 3D glasses.


Receive Commission and Staff Requests and Reports:


Public Comments:
