

# ***Accomplishments/Awards/Commendations***

- October 2016 - Lieutenant Gary McDaniel and Lieutenant Mark LiVigni received Civic Achievement Bars for their work on coordinating the efforts with the faith-based and community group programs.
- October 2016 - Numerous other Officers and Civilian Police Personnel also received Civic Achievement Bars for their assistance with the faith-based and community group programs.
- October 24, 2016 - Sergeant Adrian Tijerina and Officer Ben Shipman received commendations for arresting two Burglary of Motor Vehicle suspects that had extensive criminal histories.
- October 12, 2016 - Officers Ben Luna, Duaine Mayo, and Darius Williams received Commendations for their team work in making a two-vehicle felony stop and recovering a stolen vehicle and arresting a felon.
- December 19, 2016 - Numerous Officers were awarded Certificate of Merit for their roles in the arrest of a barricaded person wanted for Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon Family Violence.
- December 2016 - Officer Sisk received Outstanding Crime Prevention Specialist – Small Agency, from the Texas Chisholm Trail Crime Prevention Association for 2016.

# *Department Activity*

October 2016 – December 2016

- Number of Use of Force incidents: There were eight Use of Force incidents which occurred during this period. The completed Use of Force investigations indicated that all were lawful and within policy. One Use of Force incident is still under investigation. This incident was an officer-involved shooting which occurred in Dallas, Texas.
- Vehicle Pursuits: There were four vehicle pursuits and all were determined to be within policy.
- Number of Complaints: Three internally generated complaints, one resulted in a 7 day suspension, one resulted in a written reprimand, and one resulted in an indefinite suspension.
- Community Meeting and Partnerships: We held 24 community events and had more than 2,894 partnerships in the community.


