- Captain Greg Chase promoted to Assistant Fire Chief





Accomplishments :

I. Paramedic School Valedictorian

- Philip Clark graduated Valedictorian of Brookhaven College Paramedic Class No. 3

II. Fire Prevention

- Completed our Neighborhood Smoke Detector Installations for 2016.
 - Knocked on 503 doors
 - Made contact with 199 residents
 - Installed a total of **363** detectors
 - Checked, replaced batteries and/or installed smoke detectors in 149 homes

III. Fire Loss

- City of Duncanville had **NO** residential fire loss for the months of October, November and December

IV. Emergency Management

- Conducted points of dispensing site assessment at Duncanville High School with DCHHS for the high school to be used as a dispensing site during a public health emergency
- Debris Removal & Debris Monitoring RFP – Proposals due back on March 2nd
- Submitted grant for City of Cedar Hill for an emergency generator for Tri City Animal Shelter
- Emergency Management Intern from UNT Emergency Management Program assisting to develop a resource inventory of city owned resources for Cedar Hill, DeSoto, Duncanville and Lancaster

IV. Continuation of Emergency Management Accomplishments

- Submitted Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) to Texas Division of Emergency Management to seek reimbursement for a % of emergency management cost for work plan items which include emergency management planning, training, exercises and community emergency preparedness
- Table top exercises & trainings conducted:
 - Oct 5th: Cyber Disruption and Continuity of Operations Table Top
 - Oct 13th: Tour of Ellis-Davis Field House and Hurricane Plan developed
 - Oct 20th: Radiological Training and Table Top Exercise
 - Nov 3rd: Tour of North Central Texas Trauma Regional Advisory Council (NTTRAC)
 - Nov 11th: North Central Texas Big X 2016 Full Scale Exercise
 - Nov 17th: Tour of American Red Cross Disaster Supply Warehouse
 - Dec 1st: Winter Weather Table Top Exercise
 - Jan 17th & 24th: Severe Weather Training for SWRCC
 - Feb 2nd: Debris Management Seminar




Accomplishments :

V. Emergency Medical Services

- (3) Paramedics to attend Community Paramedic School/Training beginning March 20th
- New ePCR system incorporated
- Incorporated new Wi-Fi intubation system for securing advanced airways
- Submitted an application for Assistant to Firefighters Grant (AFG) for (3) Lifepak 15's and (4) Lucas CPR devices
- New ambulance is scheduled to arrive in April 2017.
- (2) Paramedics to attend Tactical Paramedic School/Training in May 2017
