

Burglary of Motor Vehicles




Burglary of a Motor Vehicle (BMV) is a crime of opportunity where citizens can help reduce opportunities of being a victim.

The program is simple: **TAKE, LOCK, HIDE**; Take your keys, Lock your car, and Hide your belongings. Following these steps will reduce the risk of being a victim of car burglary.

The Duncanville Police Department is starting a new program. Officers will be walking parking lots and other areas to place report cards on vehicles letting individuals know if they did a good job or if there are issues with the car - like leaving it unlocked, valuables in plain sight, etc. (see sample report card to the left).

The TAKE, LOCK, HIDE program targets areas that have a number of parking spaces. For example, shopping centers, apartment complexes, large businesses and hotels are areas with numerous parking spaces. This program does not just work at these locations; it works at homes.



Burglary of a Motor Vehicle is an increasing crime in the United States, and it takes the citizens to remove the opportunity from the criminals. If you do not provide the opportunity, you reduce the odds of being a victim. Keep a list of your property including brand name, serial numbers and model numbers of items you routinely carry in your vehicle so if you forget to take something out, you will have the information to assist with recovery.

Park in a well-lit area close to the building. While parking in an isolated spot may reduce door dings, a

criminal looks for cars parked out of the way in order to help ensure less attention is drawn to them.

Texting and Driving

House Bill 62, the distracted driving legislation, was signed into law by Governor Gregg Abbott in June 2017 and went into effect on September 1, 2017. The new law is geared to crack down on distracted driving and save citizens from accidents and deaths on roads across the state.

According to the Texas Department of Public Safety, 455 people were killed and 3,000 people were seriously injured in distracted driving accidents in 2016. Statistics show 40 percent of people between the ages of 19 and 39 admit they text and drive. The average person sending or reading a text spends 4.6 seconds with their eyes off the road, which correlates roughly to driving the length of a football field blind at 55 miles per hour. This means the average driver is driving many miles "blind" when they are texting and driving. Statistics also show texting while driving makes a car accident 23 times more likely to occur.

The law states an operator commits an offense if the operator uses a portable wireless communication device to read, write or send an electronic message while operating a motor vehicle unless the vehicle is stopped. To be prosecuted, the behavior must be committed in the presence of or within the view of a peace officer or established by other evidence. It is considered a Class "C" Misdemeanor punishable by a fine of at least \$25 and not more than \$99, unless it is shown on the trial of the offense the defendant has been previously convicted at least one time for the same offense, in which event the offense is punishable by a fine of at least \$100 and not more than \$200. If it is shown on the trial of the offense the defendant caused serious bodily injury or the death of another then it is considered a Class "A" Misdemeanor punishable by fine not to exceed \$4,000 and confinement in jail for a term not to exceed one year (Texas Transportation Code Section 545.4251 – Use of Portable Wireless Communication Device for Electronic Messaging).

It is still legal for motorists in most cities to use their GPS navigation, music apps and dial phone numbers, but drivers may still get pulled over if an officer suspects them of texting. Motorists should keep in mind law enforcement will be on the lookout for drivers whose heads are down and who are swerving. A swerving vehicle, commonly an indicator of an intoxicated driver, is now more often than not an indicator for someone texting and driving. Instead of texting, seek out a hands-free technology like a Bluetooth headset or an app with a dictation function. For most Texas drivers, there are no restrictions on using a phone to make or receive a call while driving.

Remember driving is a privilege, not a right. You get a driver's license based on the skills you have and the rules you agree to follow. If you fail to follow the rules, you will be ticketed or even lose your license. You owe it to the other roadway users and yourself to operate the vehicle in a safe manner.
