I. OBJECTIVES

To assure minimum delay to highway users traffic offenders who are traveling under emergency conditions.

II. RULES

- A. Except when a supervisor permits otherwise or the patient passenger is transferred to an emergency vehicle, traffic offense charges brought against a driver who is apparently enroute to an emergency facility for the purpose of obtaining emergency medical care for a person who apparently requires immediate medical attention shall be by the filing of a complaint with the court clerk instead of by arrest or the issuance of a citation at the time of the offense.

- B. Except when a supervisor permits otherwise, traffic offense charges brought against a physician driver and is apparently enroute to provide emergency care to a patient shall be by filing a complaint with the court clerk instead of by an arrest or the issuance of a citation at the time of the offense.

- C. Except when a supervisor permits otherwise, traffic offense charges brought against the driver of an emergency vehicle shall be by filing a complaint with the court clerk instead of by an arrest or the issuance of a citation at the time of the offense.
