I. POLICY

It is the policy of this Department to adhere to the Texas Government Code, Section 411.1471, and other laws and mandates concerning the collection of DNA from certain arrested persons.

II. PROCEDURES

- A. Officers will, immediately after the arrest of a person required to submit DNA samples, cause the sample to be gathered during the book-in procedure.
- B. Persons required to submit samples must have a prior conviction and/or been placed on deferred adjudication for one of the below specified offenses and must be currently arrested for at least one of the below specified offenses.
1. Aggravated Kidnapping (with intent to cause bodily injury, or violate/abuse sexually)
 2. Indecency with a Child
 3. Sexual Assault or Aggravated Sexual Assault
 4. Prohibited Sexual Contact
 5. Burglary of Habitation (committing or with intent to commit a non-theft felony)
 6. Compelling Prostitution
 7. Sexual Performance by a Child
 8. Possession or Promotion of Child Pornography
- C. Officers collecting DNA samples will be properly trained and will only utilize official collection kits. The collection kits are supplied by the Texas Department of Public Safety and are stored in the Duncanville Police Department Holding Facility. After collection, the officer will make a notation in the prisoner jail log that a DNA sample was taken per Regulation 9.02. The sealed collection kit shipping envelope will be placed in the outgoing mail tray in Records.
