Receive Citizen's Input:

No public comments were received.

Approval of Minutes:

The minutes from the regular Duncanville Neighborhood Vitality meeting held April 28, 2021 were approved by unanimous consent.

Discuss Boards and Commission Reappointment Form Submission to City Secretary:

Staff Jacqueline Culton shared that we have two commissioners up for reappointment. Also, that this was an opportunity to apply for other boards.

Discuss Single Family Parking Update (Bryan G. Ramey II, P.E. – Director of Public Works):

Staff Greg Ramey shared a slide presentation covering a previously discussion to Council regarding "On-street Parking". Issues discussed included Traffic Engineer's authority to declare "No Parking" on any public street under 30' wide. (Section 19-111); other options discussed with council was a parking permit program; Residents requesting no parking would need a petition by 90% of property owners along a street segment (the items discussed did not gain

No reports were received.


Receive Staff Reports
